## **Message From Rabbi Judy Cohen-Rosenberg**

Chanukah came early to the Cohen-Rosenbergs this year. Chanukah means rededication and that is exactly what we did with a trip to Philadelphia over Thanksgiving week end. We went for the opening day of the National Museum of American Jewish History. In a sense we became part of history as we were among the first public group to tour this wonderful new resource.

The museum is located in the heart of the historic district of Philadelphia across from Independence Mall and next door to the Bourse. Though it is a modern building of brand new construction, the location connects the Jewish people with the entire history of America. This is no accident. The original, smaller museum was one block away, next door to Congregation Mikve Israel, the oldest congregation in Philadelphia, established earlier but built in 1782.

American Jewish history begins in 1654 and continues with us. We are blessed to be part of this exciting and creative enterprise. It might not be what the Maccabees of old envisioned for the future of Judaism, and American Judaism is one part of a whole, but we have great opportunity, not only as Americans, but as Jews, to contribute to our country and the world. Our roots are in Torah but also in the Constitution. Let us all celebrate our freedom this Chanukah by rededicating ourselves to understanding our history.

I hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving and is looking forward to Hanukkah.

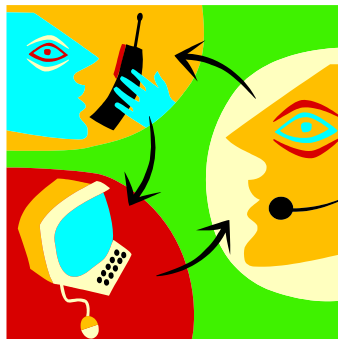
