## **Message From Rabbi Judy Cohen-Rosenberg**

Haiti's earthquakes and the devastation they wrought have caused us to look outside ourselves and extend our hands to those in need far from our home. If you have not already made a contribution to relief efforts, this month's Social Action Committee article lists some reputable organizations to which you may donate. As survivors reunite with family in our area, we will partner with St. Brigid's Parish Outreach and provide whatever aid we can.

As we follow relief efforts, as Jews we have to be proud of Israel's response as well. Israeli teams of medical and rescue personnel rushed to Haiti to provide much needed skill and expertise. Israel often sends teams to offer humanitarian aid in times of international crisis; it is gratifying that in this instance Israel is receiving credit and benefitting from some "good press".

Israel, however, is not receiving good marks for religious freedom. The Women of the Wall (WOW) are still prohibited from praying at the Kotel, the Western Wall, wearing Tallitot and may not read from the Torah there either. The Israeli Supreme Court has ruled that the Kotel is an Orthodox synagogue and not an historic site, therefore the protocol governing Orthodox synagogues is the law. Police have arrested and fingerprinted two WOW leaders. I hope as Israelis discover that there is more than one way to practice Judaism harassment will abate, but that will take time.

For now, this is a battle to be taken up by World Jewry for we are overwhelmingly non-Orthodox. WE must convince the Israeli government to respect the practices of all branches of Judaism, particularly at sites that should belong to all Jews. You may follow this issue more closely through the website of the Israeli Religious Action Center, [www.urj.org/Israel/wow](http://www.urj.org/Israel/wow). Please join me in working to make Israel a homeland in which we have the ability to practice Judaism as we choose.

January was our month for parent - teacher conferences and this year we stretched it out over four different days. It was wonderful to have the opportunity to really talk to our parents about their children's progress as well as answer any questions they may have. Conference time is the time to sit quietly and discuss our children, to hear the parents's concerns, and to share our observations. It's hard to keep these discussions to the 15 minutes allotted.

The 3/4 year old class was busy working on the 5 senses. They've done some interesting experiments and are doing a lot of graphing and matching pairs of things. They've expanded "matching" from the math area into the language arts area by matching words and letters. They've starting working on recognition of and writing of the letters of the alphabet, and of couse they were and still are busy doing winter activities.

The 2 year old class was continuing their work on colors and shapes. This month we learned about "white". We made white projects, had a white sensory table to play in and ate marshmallows for snack. Everyone was encouraged to wear white and we felt different white textures -feathers, fur, cottonballs, bottle tops, and of course snow and ice.

Both classes talked about Martin Luther King Jr. and his dream. We talked about being kind, fair and nice, taking turns and sharing with friends. We also read some picture books showing how we all are different and all the same. What would it be like if we all looked exactly the same?

## CRT Journal

By now, you have probably seen several references to our annual Journal, getting ads for the Journal, and the dinner that marks another anniversary for CRT. Sometimes we wonder if everyone (especially newer members) knows what this is all about. So here's a stab at a description.

- First, and foremost, the Journal is one of our most important fund raisers at CRT. In nearly every not-for-profit organization, expenses (led by salaries) exceed normal income (that is, dues and fees). We must make up the short-fall by raising funds so we can keep the lights on, the oil tank full, and our staff paid.
- Second, we want to honor certain individuals and couples who make CRT the special place it is. Our honorees have ranged from Founders and Rabbi Judy to "unsung heroes;" that is, people who do not often (or ever) take the spotlight, but who invariably say "Hineni" when help is needed.
- Third, we distribute the Journal at a Dinner Dance which is a time not only to officially acknowledge the honorees, but to celebrate another year of CRT's providing a Reform Jewish presence in this area. This year we will again hold the dinner in our social hall, catered by Fran Zaslow Caterers.

How does it work? What do you have to do?

- Basically, there are two types of ads:
  - An ad from a local business which you personally patronize; or a business ad from a company with whom you do business, professionally; or your own business or professional practice
  - A personal ad, from you to the honorees (or the congregation)
- We ask that you approach those businesses that you patronize and let them know they can show their appreciation by supporting your temple. They can also benefit by reaching an audience of people like you.
- One of the benefits for full-dues-paying members is that they can get a \$100 credit on their dues for soliciting or placing at least \$100 of ads!
- Another benefit is that you can attend the dinner if you solicit (or place) at least \$275 (per couple; \$150 for one person) in ads.

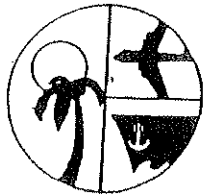

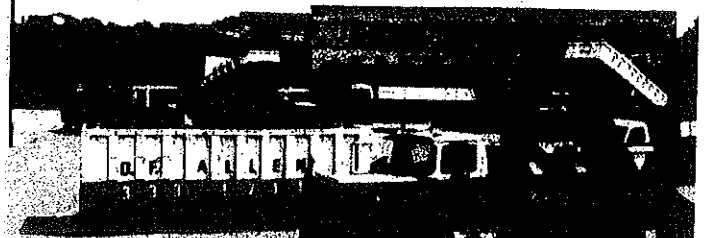
