Message From Rabbi Judy Cohen-Rosenberg

I am grateful to Rabbi Michael White of Temple Sinai of Roslyn for writing so eloquently and truthfully about the effect of Shabbat Service attendance on the body and soul. Here, with some additions of my own, are his words:

A typical week for all of us: Running, working shopping, schlepping, eating on the fly, worries over money, worries over our parents, worries over our children, too little sleep, too little laughter, no time for quiet contemplation.

Friday night services are the best ancient medicine for life's crazy whirlwind. They take one hour, they last a week! We begin by singing to clear the mind of all its clutter and anxiety. The music is uplifting and inspiring, catchy and easy to sing. There is always a friend to greet, a baby to celebrate, a soul to comfort after loss. Your presence is appreciated and desired. You will feel purposeful and fulfilled.

Community. Laughter. Time to think beyond the pressing realities of the week. Time to focus on who we are, on why God created us, on what brings true joy, on what matters most in life. Time to think about creating a the lasting legacy we might leave our children, grandchildren and the generations to come, about peace, about family, about giving back.

And there is the Oneg-cake and coffee, a moment to share a smile and a story with neighbors and friends.

One hour on Friday nights. Come often. Even if you don't know Hebrew at first. Even if you don't sing. Even if you feel lost at first. Come, and keep coming. You'll get the hang of it. And then, suddenly, without warning, God will enter your heart and warm it. God will enter your mind and expand it. God will enter your soul and fill it with gratitude for life's joys and sweetness. And then, you might become addicted.

CRT is getting an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) which is a device that performs an analysis of heart rhythm and determines if defibrillation is required and if needed delivers an electric shock to an individual. This life saving device is a legal requirement for many public places and while CRT is not required to have one, the generosity of a couple of families will ensure that we do. Contributions from Jeanie Corn in memory of her mother Barbara Steiker and from Cary and Bob Markman have funded the purchase of an AED. An AED is one of those things that you never want to have to use, but if you need it it's a great thing to have in the building as a quick response time when someone is having chest pain is critical. Training will be provided to the professional staff , but these are designed to be used by regular people not medical professionals and to quote Ken "grab it, bring it to the person, put the pads on their chest and hit the button, the AED does the rest". Thanks again to Jeanie, Cary and Bob and also to Perry Glickman and Ken Praga for doing the research and championing the cause.

The books for this month: Now that I discovered Daniel Silva's Gabirel Allon series of books I'm reading them. A quick recap: Allon is an Israeli spy (semi-retired) who is also restores classic art. I read the first two books in the series "The Kill Artist" where Allon battles renegade PLO terrorists (read the book this makes sense) and "The English Assassin" as he hunts for works of art taken from Jews by the Nazis. Ben asked me to read Elie Wiesel's "Night", he read it in school and thought I would like it so I'm reading it. I also started Bernard Cornwell's "Arthur" series which is his retelling of the Arthur legend.

Preschool News.....

February was a short month but we packed a lot into it. We learned about Groundhog Day, Shadows, and TbB'Shevat (birthday of trees), and our past presidents Abraham Lincoln and George Washington. Our classes have been working on units about shadows and ecology- the caring and protecting of our earth's resources. We're constantly recycling in preschool and will continue with our ecology work through Earth Day in April.

The 4 yr.old class was busy with making bar graphs and asking everyone which were their "favorites". They've been learning all the letters of the alphabet and the sounds they make; working on reading readiness skills using both phonics and word recognition. They've also been practicing writing letters and numbers, doing their individual calendars and tracing and cutting skills. The children have been playing lots of games and singing lots of songs using the inside play area. Their easel paintings have been outstanding and each one tells a story. The children made beautiful snowflakes and are busy creating their own alphabet picture books. During lunch they listen to classical music and jazz.

The 3 yr.old class is learning to recognize numbers and letters and some sight words. They've been playing many different alphabet games and using the sensory table to hide letters. They've been playing word games, finding rhyming words and opposites. They've made adorable penguins and igloos, bird feeders(using pine cones and bird seed) and snowmen using shaving cream and glue. The class has been playing parachute games and having lots of fun.

Both the 3 & 4 yr.old classes made log cabins(using pretzels and cake icing) for Presidents Week. Half of the food was put on the project and the other half eaten. Both classes were invited to Maria's Bakery in Westbury for a class trip by Neil's dad Joe. It was a very special opportunity for us to see a bakery in action and taste their "goodies". A big thank you to the DeLucia family- we really had a great time.

The 2 yr.old class looked at their shadows, made funny bug hats and red, white and blue collages for President's Week. They also used white fingerpaint for their "snowy day picture". They've been using our inside "gym" a lot- playing with hoops, tunnels, tents, trampolines, bikes, bubbles, balls and musical instruments, and dancing with scarves.

Spring is coming and we can't wait to play outside.
