Wow October was a busy month.

The community service with Temple Emanu-El held on October 15 at Temple Emanu-El was a big success. We had over forty people attend and it was a great experience. This month Temple Emanu-El will be coming to CRT on November 19th for the second joint service. I hope that you can attend so we can make them feel as welcome as they made us feel.

CRT hosted the East Meadow Jewish Community Relations Council Israel Bond Breakfast on Sunday morning October 24. Our honoree Norm Labelson gave a great speech about Israel and even wore a hat he got there on his honeymoon. Close to 200 people attended and over \$154,000 of Israel bonds were sold this year which to put it in perspective is \$30,000 more than last year and \$75,000 more than 2008 so they had a good day too!! This just reinforces the notion that without American support Israel would not be the Israel we know and it's a good investment. A huge thank you needs to go to Sisterhood and Men's Club for setting everything up and to Ann Middleman and Howard Wasserman who sang the national anthems of the America and Israel.

Benjamin, Zachary and I went on the Men's Club/Sisterhood trip to Ellis Island with about twenty other people. If you have not been there, it is quite an experience to stand in the great hall where many of our ancestors stood. I was trying to imagine the crowds, confusion and noise that people from different

countries make when thousands of them are in the room at the same time, it must have been overwhelming. There are a lot of photos taken at Ellis Island of immigrants on display and one thing Rabbi and I noticed was that you could tell who was Jewish by looking at their eyes. Whether by design or not when you looked at non-Jews their eyes tended to be happy or relieved. The eyes of the Jews were tired and sad; maybe it had something to do with the fact that they were escaping an ordeal by coming to America. I don't know but it was eerie and one of those things that once you notice it that jumps out at you again and again. It was a great day topped off a stop at the official CRT restaurant in China Town!!

You'll notice additional names in the Kol Nidre pledge list later in this issue, a couple of names were accidentally omitted last month and some represent new pledges. Thanks to all members and friends who made pledges. The Thanksgiving Interfaith services will be held on November 21st at Temple Emanu-El; since I know you know how to get there I hope you can make it. This is always a good service and it's nice to see the different faiths work together. No matter how you slice it we as Americans have a lot to be thankful for, it's not about turkey or football, it's about the country that developed and the freedoms we all share.

You may have noticed that one of the glass doors in the atrium was broken. It seems to have

spontaneously cracked without any provocation, don't ask me sometimes things like this happen. The replacement will be in shortly but it goes to show that the unexpected happens.

Preschool News.....

October was a calm and happy month in preschool. The classes are doing fine and all the children have adjusted to school and seem happy to be here. It's time now to start concentrating on the Autumn season in our classrooms. Our Friday visits with Rabbi Judy have begun and our preschoolers really look forward to seeing her. They have a great time- singing songs and eating Challah bread.

On Friday, October 16, parents and caretakers were invited to a small cake and coffee reception to "meet and greet" each other. .It's an opportunity for the parents to get to know each other and make new friends.

The 4 year old class is working on rhyming words and breaking words into syllables. Every day they work on the calendar and observe and report and record the weather. They're learning to print and spell their names by tracing over the lower case letters. They learn new vocabulary words each month that are from the units they're studying.

For October, the words were harvest, vine, gourd, explorers, and globe. They're doing simple science and math experiments with apples, pumpkins and gourds; dissecting them and charting their results.

The 3 year old class has been working on colors, numbers, and shapes. They've also been doing simple science and math experiments with apples and pumpkins and learning about the fall season and the changes it brings. Everyday they have circle time, read books, sing songs and do an art project. They're learning to recognize their names and the letters in the name. There's always plenty of time for musical instruments and playing with the parachute and trampolines.

The 2 year olds are adjusting to school and separating from "mommy". They're learning classroom boundaries and basic social skills. We've started working with painting and glueing and coloring. We're still working on sitting as a group for storytime and circle time. Everyone enjoys our musical instruments, playing outside and eating snack.

We look forward to a great school year with many wonderful events awaiting us.
