There are almost no super powers here, it's the story of a boy who witnesses persecution first hand and how it shaped his life. This book stands on its own as an outstanding holocaust story.

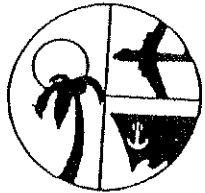

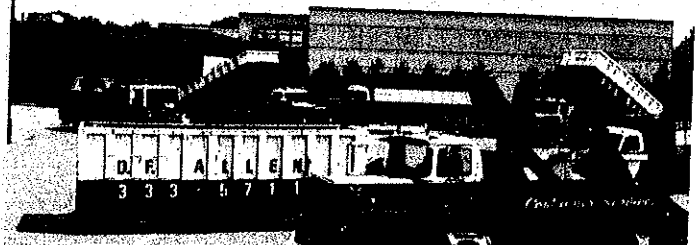
